- 1. That the people of God have always been plan "A" for bringing the good news to the lost world. Be motivated.
- 2. That we serve a faithful God in a hostile world. Trust God.

People never regret choosing Jesus.

Will I hold to an expectation that God will do what I think is best for me? Will I trust that God will do what is best for His Kingdom, which includes me? If I cling to God through the person of Jesus, trust will follow.

- Through Abraham (1-4)
- Through Moses (5-10)
- Through Joshua (11-13)
