Turmoil is the result of conflict.

Wholeness is the result of peace.

Biblical peace is the absence of conflict and the presence of wholeness.

We must come to peace with our lack of peace.

"We make war that we may live in peace." -Aristotle

- Separated from Christ (12a)
- Excluded from citizenship (12b)
- Ignorant of the covenant (12c)
- Without hope (12d)
- Without God (12e)

See where you are (vs 13)

Know what Christ has done (vs 14-18)

- He is our peace (14)
- He brought us peace (15-18)

Understand the implications (vs 19-22)

- We are the people of God (19)
- We are being built (20-22)
